Medical consultation with GP (10mins)	£50 + prescription charge
Home visit	£100
Copies of medical records for living patients	
Copies of reports for patients – per side	0.50p
Health records held on computer	£50
Health records held manually	£10
Health records held in part on computer and in part manually	£10

Fees must be paid in advance at the time the request for the letter or form to be completed is made or when the appointment for a medical is booked.

Failure to attend a booked appointment for any of the above services will be charged at the full price.
